# SOUTH EAST FOREST NATIONAL PARK AND EGAN PEAKS NATURE RESERVE DRAFT AMENDMENT TO THE PLAN OF MANAGEMENT

#### Introduction

# Returning threatened and declining species and improving ecosystem health

Bushwalking NSW supports the proposed establishment of a feral predator-free area in South East Forest National Park. We also support opportunities for the public to visit the area through guided walks.

## Recognising and improving the Bundian Way

Bushwalking NSW applauds the support of the NPWS in fulfilling the vision of the Indigenous community to develop a walking track from Turemulerrer (Twofold Bay) to Targangal (Mount Kosciuszko). We consider the reinstatement of this culturally significant walking route to not only be one of the most outstanding walking experiences in Australia but would also play an important role in promoting awareness and understanding of Indigenous culture and an important step in the reconciliation process between Indigenous and non-Indigenous Australians. It will also support regional tourism in South East NSW.

The development of a walking track and two low-impact walk-in campsites is also supported. We look forward to members of our affiliated clubs and other bushwalkers walking this route in the not-too-distant future.
