- Leadership Training development of leadership course
- Conservation advocate on key conservation issues eg invasive species, inappropriate development in protected areas
- Tracks & Access advocate for new walking tracks and bushwalkers access eg via Crown lands/roads
- First Nations joint management of National Parks
- Young People in Clubs Jon Gray discussed the need for image change to attract young members eg. new terminology. Club participants are only 1% of walkers/hikers mainly over 55 years. Bushwalking Clubs may become redundant without young people.
